# New Jersey Counties Excess Joint Insurance Fund Claims Committee's Best Practices Workshop Liability and Workers' Compensation Cost Containment Strategies Overview

On October 7, 2014, the New Jersey Counties Excess Joint Insurance Fund (CELJIF) held its third Best Practices Workshop on Liability and Workers' Compensation Cost Containment Strategies. Prior to the event, a Planning Committee was formulated to discuss the Agenda and format of the workshop.

The workshop consisted of five presentations. Michelle Leighton of Conner Strong & Buckelew moderated the program and began the program with introductions and opening remarks. Joe Hrubash of PERMA presented The Year in Review and a Look Ahead relating to the Commissions. Marian Jones Bell of Safety National, our excess worker compensation carrier, conducted an overview of the MAP Client Services, a Set of Resources to Assist in Workers 'Compensation, Management, Analysis and Preventation. Marc H. Pfeifer, of Rutgers, the State University, discussed Managing Technology Risk in Public Entities. Glen Prince of J. A. Montgomery Risk Control spoke to the group regarding Best Practices and Strategies to address repeat incidents.

The group then had a break-out session led by Robyn Walcoff and Lauren Coleman of Conner Strong & Buckelew where Commission members discussed strategies on best practices and worked on collaborative solutions to address repeat incidents. Dean Sizemore, Mike Smith, Lou DiAngelo and Bonnie Ridolfino addressed the group speaking about the challenges of repeat claims and how one can combat the problem.

The workshop concluded with a presentation by Jeffry D. Newby, Esquire, of Weber Gallagher, reviewing some cases which involved New Jerseys' Worker Compensation Case Law Updates. A question and answer period was followed by lunch and networking opportunities. The workshop was held at Conner Strong & Buckelew's Marlton Headquarters with video conferencing available from the Toms River and Parsippany offices. The workshop was successful with great attendance. We look forward to our next workshop and appreciated everyone's participation.

This policy covers the positions of Executive Director, Third Party Administrator, and the Treasurer. The annual premium is \$1,132.00. The limit per loss is \$1,000,000 with a \$10,000 deductible. The cost of this coverage will be paid out of the miscellaneous and contingency budget line.

	GCIC Property and Casualty Financial Fast Track (Page 17) - Included in the agenda on page 17 is a copy of the August Property & Casualty Financial Fast Track Report. As of August 31, 2014 the Commission has a surplus of \$3,067,254. Line 8 of the report, "Investment in Joint Venture" is the Gloucester County Insurance Commission's share of the equity in the CEL. Gloucester County Insurance Commission's current equity in the CEL is \$1,097,997.

□ NJ CEL Property and Casualty Financial Fast Track (Page 18) – Included in the agenda on page 18 is a copy of the CEL Financial Fast Track Report for the month of August. As of August 31st the Fund has a surplus of \$4,872,494. ☐ Health Benefits Financial Fast Track (Page 19) - Included in the agenda on page 19 is a copy of the Health Benefits Financial Fast Track for the month of August. As of August 31, 2014 there is a surplus of \$118,759. □ NJ Excess Counties Insurance Fund (CELJIF) (Pages 20-21) The CEL met on September 25, 2014. A summary report of their meeting is included in the agenda on pages 20-21. At that meeting the Board of Fund Commissioners scheduled a meeting on October 23, 2014 at 1:00 PM to introduce the 2015 budget and another meeting on November 20, 2014 to adopt the budget. The Board of Fund Commissioners also approved the 2013 Audit. The Underwriting Manager gave an update on the excess and ancillary renewal but stressed the importance of returning the applicable underwriting data timely from the membership which has delayed budget formulation. He also indicated that the CEL will be reviewing the adequacy of the current flood aggregate. In addition the underlying Commissions may be asked to retain a higher WC retention to offset increase in medical expenses and to raise the attachment point for the workers compensation buffer layer. □ 2015 Property & Casualty Budget Introduction – The CEL Executive Director will present the 2015 proposed budget for review and discussion at their meeting this afternoon. A public hearing will be scheduled for November 20, 2014 at 2:00 PM. Since the Gloucester County Insurance Commission does not have a meeting scheduled for November, the budget will be introduced at our December 18<sup>th</sup> meeting. The 2015 budget adoption and public hearing will be held at the January 2015 meeting. □ 2014 Property & Casualty Assessments – The third and final assessment payment for 2014 was due on October 15, 2014. The Treasurer's office advises they have received payment from the College, Library, Improvement Authority, and the Utility Authority. □ 2015 Auto ID Cards/WC Posting Notices/ Renewal Certificate of Insurance – The 2015 auto ID cards and WC Posting Notices will be sent to each member entity representative for distribution the first week of December. The Executive Director's office will review with Ms. Ridolfino any certificates which need to be re-issued for the 2015 renewal. □ Reporting of Claims to Claims Made Policies Prior to 12/31/14 Expiration (Pages 22-28) – Included in the agenda on pages 22-28 is a copy of a letter from Ms. Leighton regarding reporting of claims to claims made policies prior to 12/31/14 along with the applicable limit schematics. Ms. Leighton will review the information with the Commission.

**2015 Budget:** Executive Director reported the fund has historically introduced budgets in November and adopted in December. In order to comply with the municipal regulations' timeline of certification of annual assessments the Board of Fund Commissioners scheduled a 1pm meeting on October 23, 2014 to introduce the 2015 budget and a 2pm meeting on November 20, 2014 to adopt the budget. The fund office will properly advertise both these meetings in the fund's official newspapers.

**December 31, 2013 Audit:** The Board of Fund Commissioners reviewed the final financial audit for the period ending December 31, 2013. Fund Auditor reported there were no findings or recommendations. Upon review, the Board adopted Resolution 32-14 approving the year-end financials and executing the Group Affidavit. The fund office will file the final report with the State following the meeting.

Amendment to the Plan of Risk Management: The Plan of Risk Management was revised to recognize the endorsement in the Lloyds of London excess liability policy to amend the aviation/aircraft exclusion to make an exception for the Unmanned Aerial Vehicle - tethered blimp. The blimp will be deployed by the County of Camden for aerial surveillance on emergency/pre-planned incidents to provide video imaging to the County's Incident Command Post. In addition, it was revised to reflect that the Ocean County Mosquito Extermination Commission has pollution coverage effective 8/7/14. The Board of Fund Commissioners adopted Resolution 33-14 amending the 2014 Plan of Risk Management.

**2014 Amended Budget:** In accordance with the regulations, the amended budget adopted by the Fund at the July meeting was advertised in the Fund's official newspapers.

**NJCE Website:** The fund's website, <u>www.njce.org</u>, continues to be updated on an as-needed basis with fund information.

**Financials:** The Financial Fast Track as of July 31, 2014 reported the Fund's current surplus of \$4.8 million.

**2015 Renewal:** The Underwriting Manager said since the fund's inception date of March 2010 the membership has grown to 9 counties representing 24 separate entities. The fund's excess

carriers are requiring 10-years of loss data for counties and their affiliated entities, as well as updated exposures from all member entities. Additionally, any claims-made policies require signed and completed applications annually. Underwriting Manager reported carriers will not provide a renewal quote unless this information is provided to them. Executive Director said email notification will be sent to Fund Commissioners and Risk Managers listing the outstanding items.

Underwriting Manager reported in addition to obtaining loss data and updated exposures the following is being managed for renewal:

- The fund currently has 11 policies being negotiated for renewal with Cyber Liability as the last ancillary coverage incorporated into the program.
- The fund's flood annual aggregate of \$50 million is being reviewed to determine if the current limits are adequate, which is shared among all NJCE members in the property program. Underwriting Manager said the fund's objective will be to obtain and review multiple quotes to increase flood aggregate limits.
- The fund's Excess Workers' Compensation limit is statutory less a member's \$250,000 Self-Insured Retention (SIR) with a few exceptions. Underwriting Manager said with the rising costs of workers' compensation claims including medical expenses, the renewal quote will include options to increase member self insured retentions.

**New Membership:** Executive Director said the fund will prepare a new member submission from Atlantic County for review at the next meeting.

**Risk Control:** Safety Director's report included a report reflecting the risk control activities from July 2014 through October 2014.

**Claims Status Summary:** AmeriHealth Casualty Services prepared a summary report of claims with large open reserves that was reviewed during Closed Session.

Best Practices Workshop Series – Liability & Workers' Compensation Strategies: A workshop will be hosted on October 7, 2014 on Liability & WC Strategies featuring several speakers and topics. Claims made policies contain reporting provisions that require an insured to place the carrier on notice within the policy period when an Insured first becomes aware of any potential claim matter. \$17,000. If agreed a resolution will be prepared for the next meeting ratifying this decision and the short term contract will be amended.

**CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE REPORT:** Executive Director reported on the Certificate of Insurance Report for the period 6/21/14 to 9/17/14. There were 135 certificates of insurance issued during this period. There was an increase in the number of certificates issued for this period due to the College's name change.

GCIC PROPERTY AND CASUALTY FINANCIAL FAST TRACK: Executive Director advised the May, June and July Property & Casualty Financial Fast Tracks were included in the agenda. As of July 31, 2014 the Commission has a surplus of \$2,937,580. Line 8 of the report, "Investment in Joint Venture" is the Gloucester County Insurance Commission's share of the equity in the CEL. Gloucester County Insurance Commission's current equity in the CEL is \$1,098,734.

**NJ CEL PROPERTY AND CASUALTY FINANCIAL FAST TRACK:** Executive Director reported the agenda included the June and July Financial Fast Tracks. Executive Director noted as of July 31<sup>st</sup> the Fund has a surplus of \$4,842,732.

**HEALTH BENEFITS FINANCIAL FAST TRACK**: Executive Director reported the May, June and July Health Benefits Financial Fast Tracks were included in the agenda. Executive Director advised as of July 31, 2014 there is a surplus of \$108,940.

NJ EXCESS COUNTIES INSURANCE FUND (CELJIF): Executive Director advised the CEL met June 26, 2014 and a summary report of that meeting was included in the agenda. Executive Director reported at that meeting the auditor presented and reviewed a draft copy of the 2013 audit. The CEL also held a public hearing on July 24, 2014 to approve and amended budget due to the addition of Ocean County. Also the CEL Fund Commissioners voted to approve the re-appointment of AmeriHealth Casualty Services as the Fund's Claims Administrator. The CEL was scheduled to meet again that afternoon.

**2014 PROPERTY & CASUALTY ASSESSMENT:** Executive Director advised the third and final assessment payment for 2014 was due on October 15, 2014. The Statement of Accounts were e-mailed on September 9, 2014 to the member entities. Payments can be made to the Gloucester County Insurance Commission and sent to the County of Gloucester, c/o Gary Schwarz, Treasurer, PO Box 337, Woodbury, NJ 08096.

#### 2015 RENEWAL APPLICATIONS AND UPDATED EXPOSURE INFORMATION:

Executive Director advised the 2015 property and casualty budget is reliant on a number of factors including updated renewal applications and exposure data. The CEL Underwriting Manager's office sent certain renewal applications and exposure data spreadsheets to Hardenbergh Insurance Group in early August. It is imperative that this information be forwarded as soon as possible to the CEL Underwriting Manager, otherwise it will hold up the budgeting process.

**POWER DMS (DOCUMENT MANAGING SYSTEM)** – The Executive Director advised the Risk Manager will be discussing this item during her report.

**NEW JERSEY COUNTIES EXCESS JOINT INSURANCE FUND – JONT INSURANCE CLAIMS COMMITTEES BEST PRACTICE WORKSHOP:** Ms. Leighton advised the date for the Workshop was scheduled for October 7, 2014. Ms. Leighton thanked all those members who helped with the planning and suggestions for the topics. This year the best practices workshop will include additional presentations from multiple outside resources. Ms. Leighton asked that those who wish to attend please RSVP to the email invitation that was sent by her office. Ms. Leighton advised a copy of agenda was included in the agenda.

#### **CEL SAFETY DIRECTOR:**

**REPORT:** Mr. McHale reviewed the June through September 2014 Risk Control Activity Report which was included in the agenda. Mr. McHale advised they were continuing their efforts with the Gloucester County EMS Department and during the September 18<sup>th</sup> meeting the Committee was advised of the updated media library and advised to access the EMS specific resources.

Mr. Sizemore commented that J. A. Montgomery held a seminar focusing on violence in the workplace, which went very well and there were 69 people in attendance.

Mr. McHale advised that they have also been in contact with the prosecutor's office about holding command staff training, which would be provided by retired Chief Keith Hummel. Funding for command staff training was available through the BRIT Safety Program, to offset some of the cost. Mr. McHale advised each session would be approximately \$325.00. Mr. McHale then concluded his report.

Mr. Sizemore suggested the remaining corrections staff and the sheriff's office also be included in the command staff training. Mr. McHale advised they were planning to reach out to the sheriff's office, but the material did not really apply to corrections.

#### RISK MANAGEMENT/UNDERWRITING SERVICES DIRECTOR:

**REPORT:** Ms. Ridolfino advised her report for services performed for the period of June 24, 2014 through September 21, 2014 was included in the agenda. Ms. Ridolfino advised she had a few action items to review.

Ms. Ridolfino advised the first item for review was the handout from Inservco, the quarterly claims by type. Inservco can now break the claims out by member and by department. One important note, the frequency we saw in 2010 has dropped. Ms. Ridolfino also advised that they were developing their training courses based upon where the losses were. Also, for 2015 Safety, which normally rolls out in January, there will be a BRIT online demonstration. It has not been rolled out yet, because they want the online demonstration to

be New Jersey specific. The program should be ready to go the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2015, as their kickoff safety topic.

Mr. McHale advised that J. A. Montgomery was working diligently to prepare the BRIT demonstration.

Ms. Ridolfino advised that following up on Commissioner Sizemore's comment about the workplace violence seminar, the library commission has asked for some workplace violence training.

Ms. Ridolfino reported there was a request from County Proper for the GCIC to consider funding Power DMS. Ms. Ridolfino explained the program was specifically designed for law enforcement departments. Ms. Ridolfino advised the County's sheriff's office and prosecutor's office were already using the program. Ms. Ridolfino advised there would be a one time total cost to the GCIC of \$5100 which would include the annual fee for one year, initial site creation and the initial training. The warden has committed to pay the renewal subscription fee. Ms. Ridolfino reported she reviewed the request with the Executive Director and he noted there were sufficient funds in the Miscellaneous Contingency line of the 2014 budget. 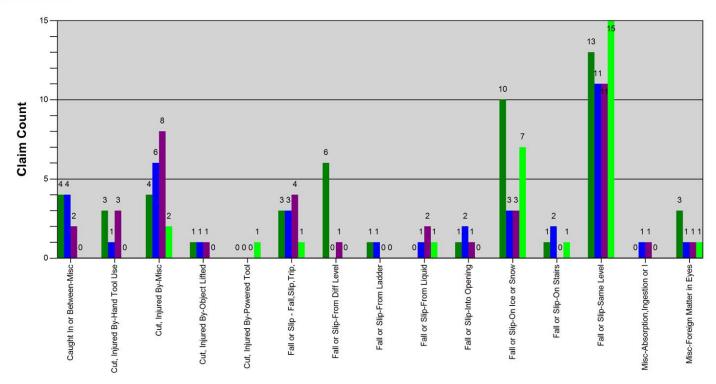

### Gloucester Co Ins Commission Workers Comp Count by Accident Code/Policy Year As of September 30, 2014

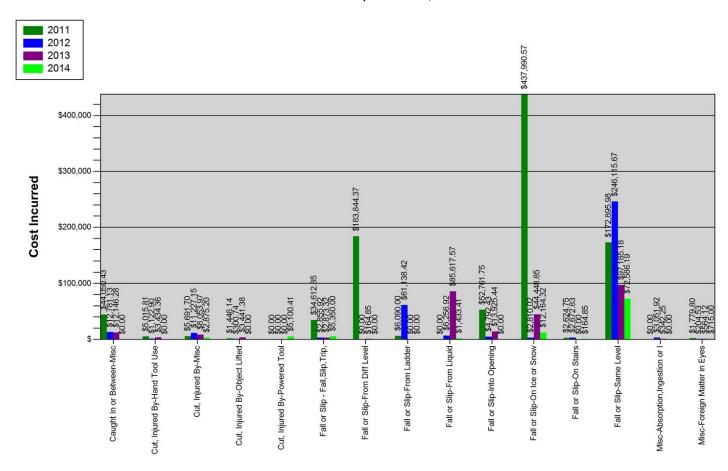








### Gloucester Co Ins Commission Workers Comp Incurred by Accident Code/Policy Year As of September 30, 2014

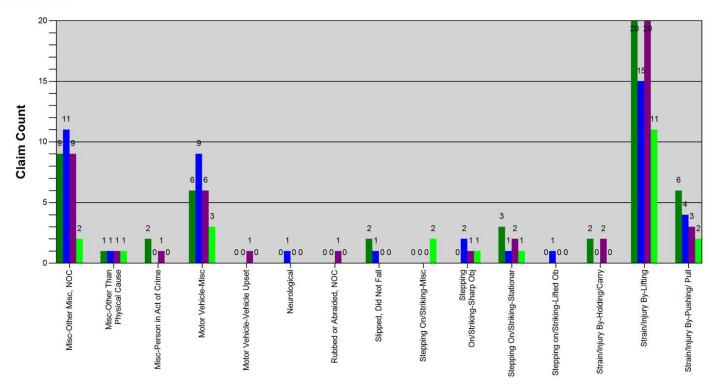






### Gloucester Co Ins Commission Workers Comp Count by Accident Code/Policy Year As of September 30, 2014

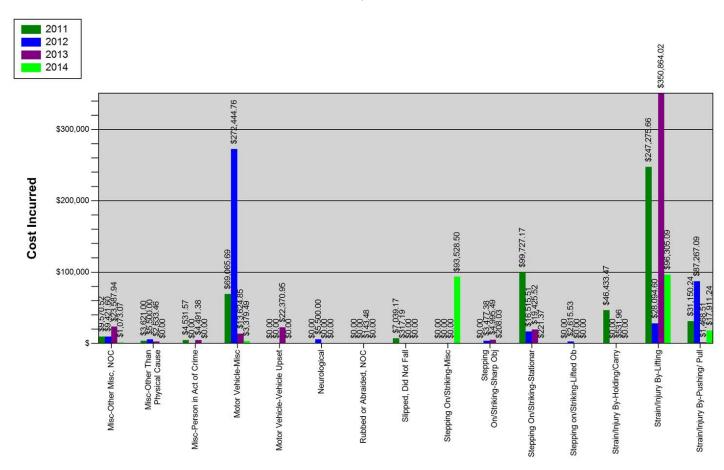








### Gloucester Co Ins Commission Workers Comp Incurred by Accident Code/Policy Year As of September 30, 2014

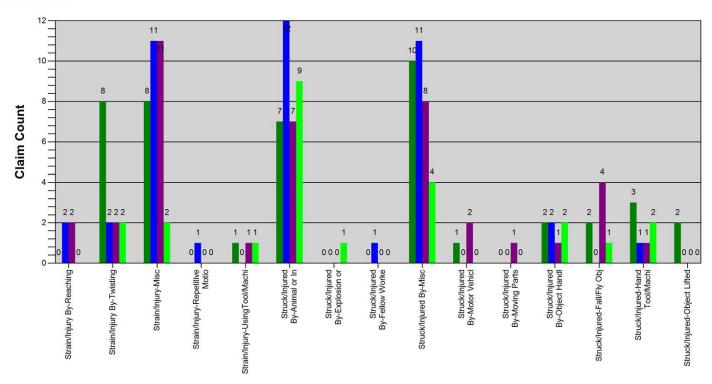






### Gloucester Co Ins Commission Workers Comp Count by Accident Code/Policy Year As of September 30, 2014

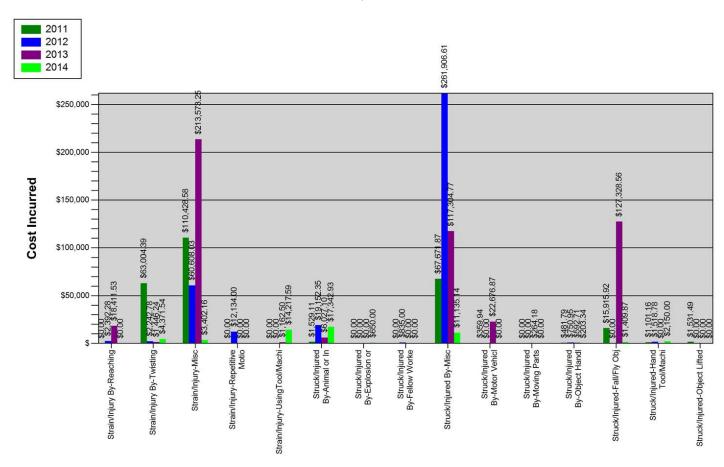






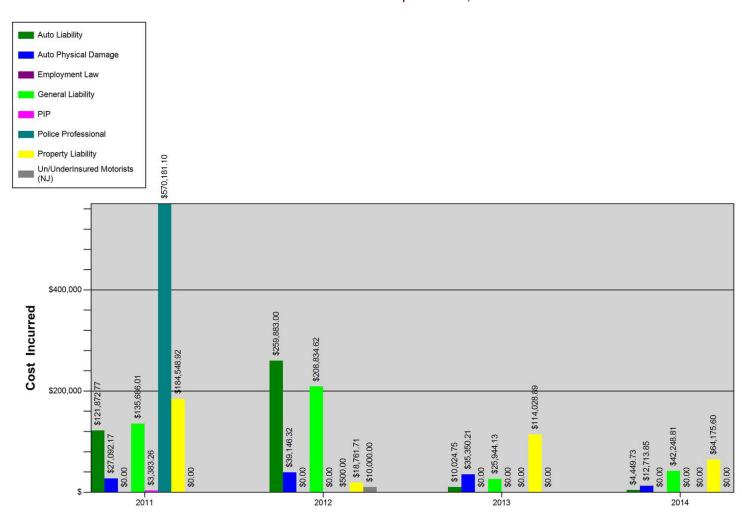


#### Gloucester Co Ins Commission Workers Comp Incurred by Accident Code/Policy Year As of September 30, 2014





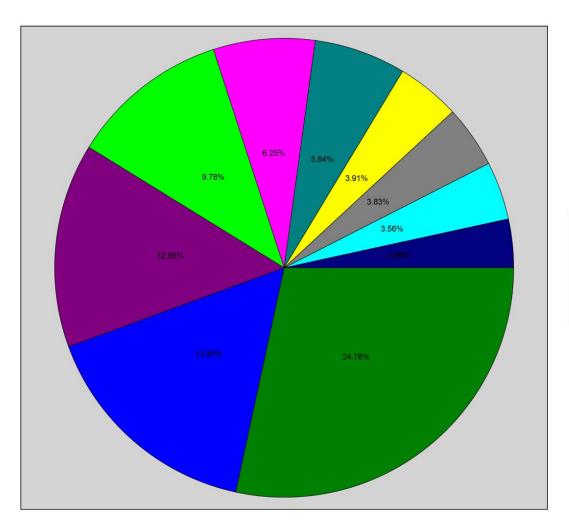
### Gloucester Co Ins Commission Incurred by Coverage/Policy Year (Not Including Workers Comp) As of September 30, 2014

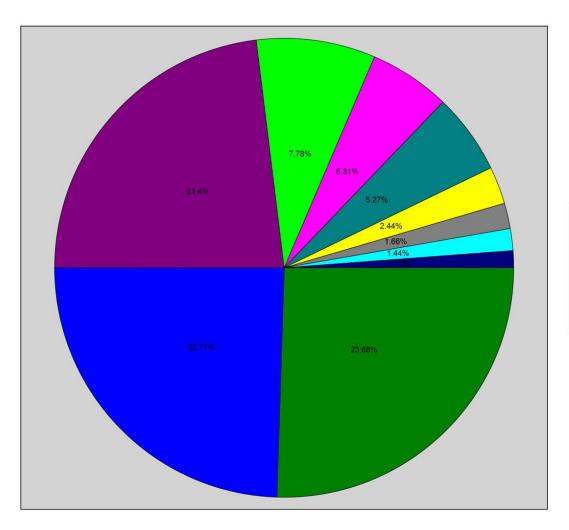

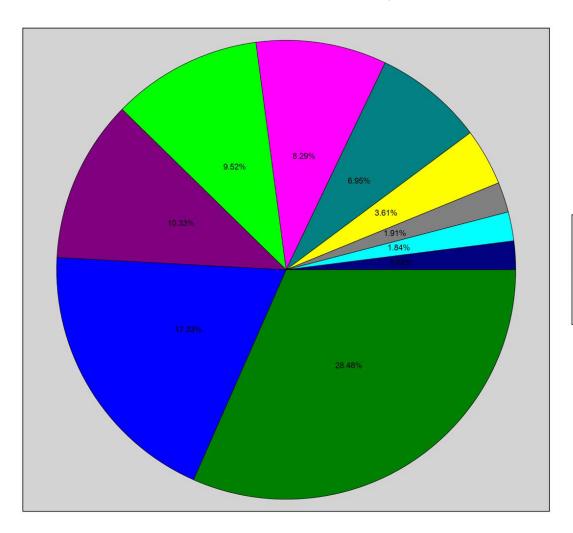

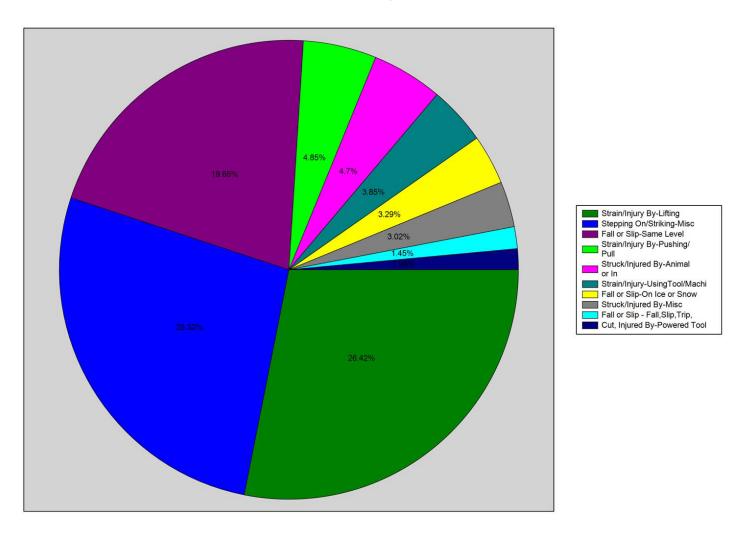
